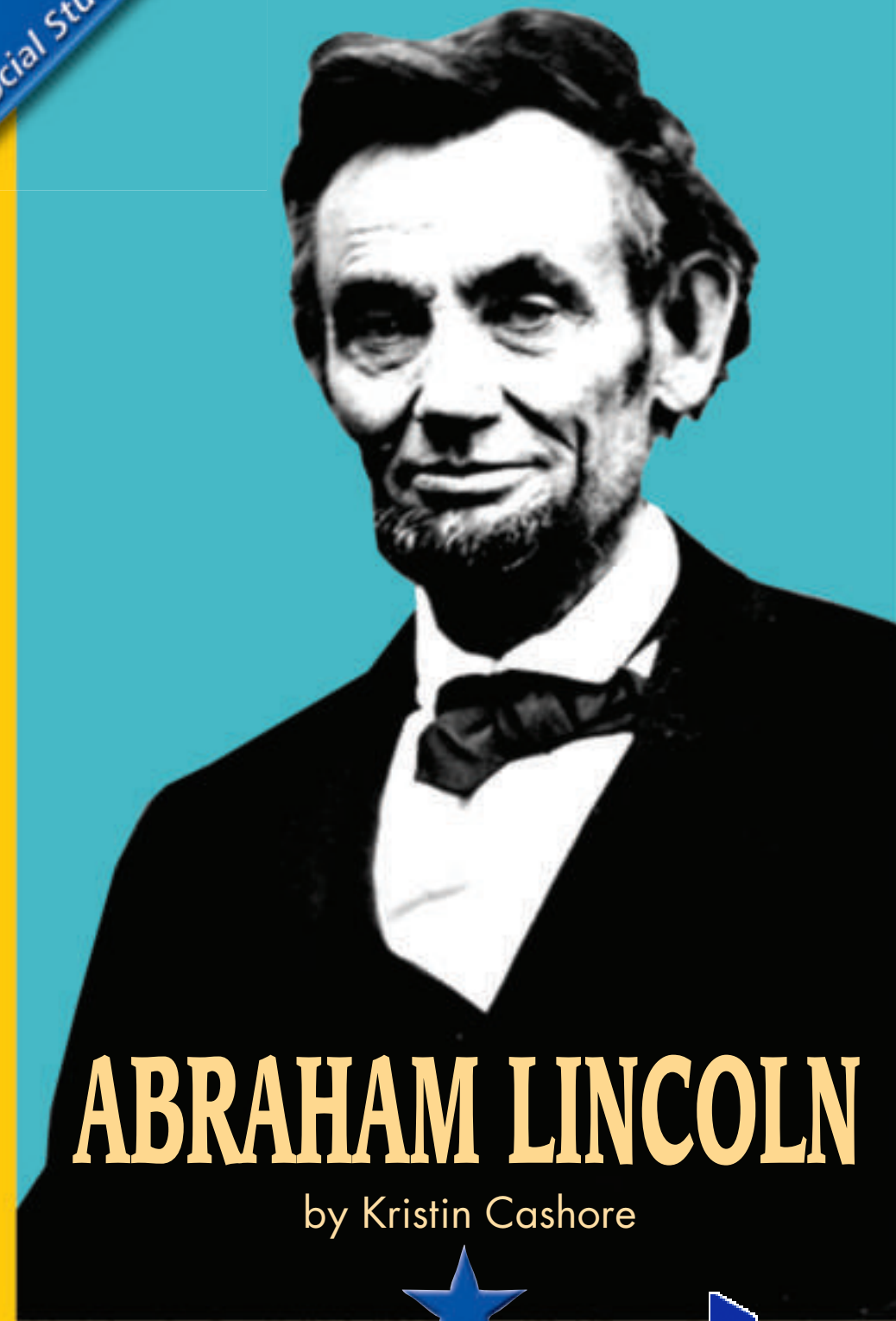
- At six feet four inches tall, Abraham Lincoln was the tallest President.

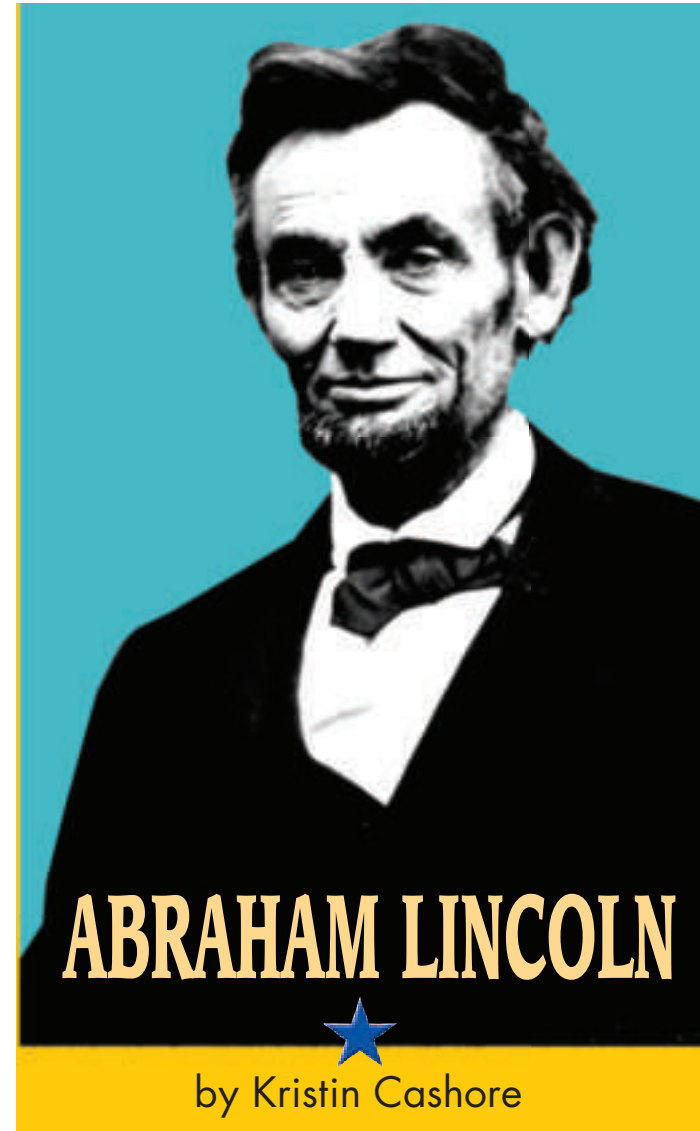

Many people in the South wanted **independence** from the rest of the country. War broke out between the North and the South.

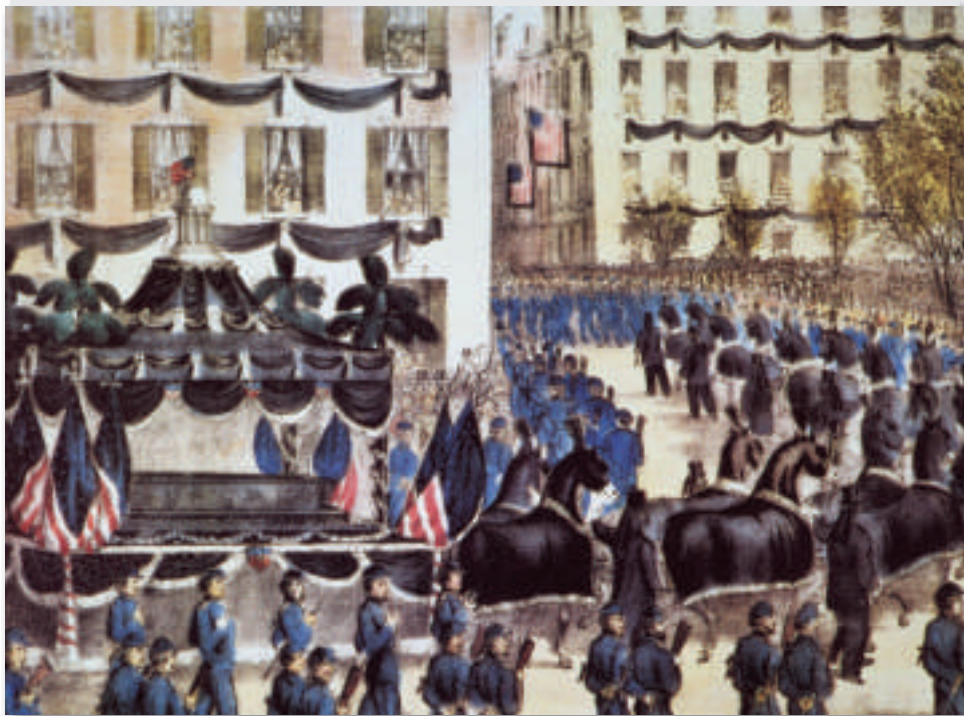


Lincoln visited battlefield camps during the Civil War.





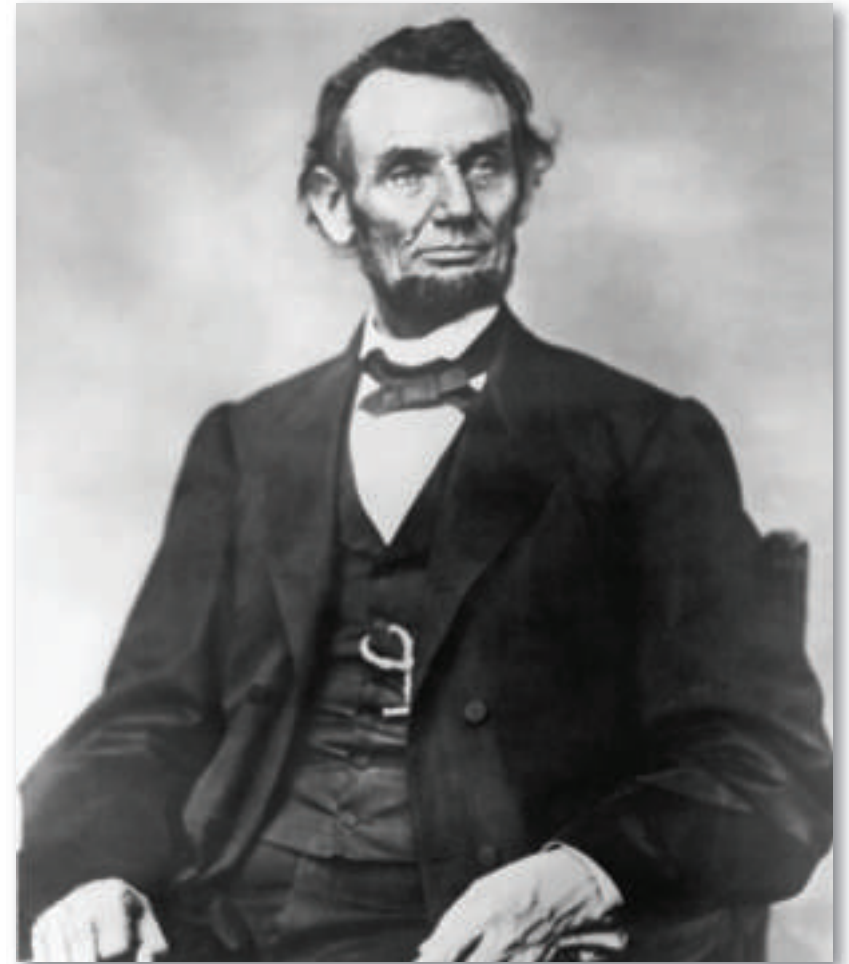
The North won the war.
